Terms of use

for the parking spaces and underground garages at the University of Regensburg (parking regulations)

§ 1 Parking permission

Parking on the grounds and in the parking garages of the University of Regensburg is only permitted for members and visitors of the university and the Ostbayerische Technische Hochschule (OTH Regensburg).

§ 2 Traffic regulations

The regulations of the road traffic act (StVO) and the road traffic licensing act (StVZO) apply on all roads and parking lots of the university. Information signs are to be observed.

§ 3 Parking

- 1. Parking is permitted in all designated surface parking lots, in the underground parking spaces, in the underground garages along the access roads and the underground roads, as long as there are no restrictions according to the StVO or fire regulations.
- 2. Parking in areas designated as reserved is only permitted with special authorization.
- 3. Parking is prohibited on the forum and lawn areas. Driving on the forum is allowed only with special permission.

§ 4 Use of the underground garages and parking garages

- 1. Parking is only permitted in the marked parking spaces. Smoking and the use of open fire, refueling, repair work, prolonged running of the engine, parking of unregistered or defective vehicles and the parking of trailers are not permitted.
- 2. Parking may not exceed 4 days unless permission has been obtained from Admin. Division V/6 in advance.

§ 5 Non-compliance with the terms of use

Vehicles parked in violation of traffic or other regulations will be towed away at the owner's expense. In addition, the university reserves the right to file charges for endangerment, obstruction, or interference with property, especially when fire department access zones, emergency exits or parking spaces for the severely disabled are affected.

§ 6 Liability

Use of the parking spaces and underground garages is at your own risk. The Free State of Bavaria is only liable for their traffic-safe condition.

§ 7 Legal validity

These regulations shall come into force on January 1, 2023. At the same time, the regulations from January 1, 2022, shall expire.
